

Goals

Our region includes Coalville, Francis, Henefer, Kamas, Oakley, and unincorporated eastern Summit County.

1. Develop a unified regional vision and green space design for the future.
 - Clearly articulate where open space and development should be located and what types they should be.
2. Develop a regional plan based on local vision.
3. Produce a picture (a map) of the desired future, illustrating locations for open space and development.
4. Implement strategies that will result in the realization of the plan that is developed.

Project Milestones



The goal is to develop a citizen-driven picture of the future, a picture that truly reflects the collective hopes of local residents. Key project milestones ensure that the plan developed represents public sentiment.

1. Analysis of regional needs, character, and identity

A steering committee that represented each participating jurisdiction shaped the overall project and directed the project team. The team met with each planning commission to understand local issues and ideals. The team also reviewed local planning documents to understand local policy, procedures, and characteristics.

2. Two public visioning workshops

The visioning workshops enabled residents to voice preferences for open space conservation and future development patterns. Residents worked with their neighbors to develop green space maps illustrating their hopes for the future.



3. Two public open houses

The public open houses give residents a chance to review and comment on the workshop maps and the resulting draft regional green space plan and implementation strategies. Public input will be used to develop a final plan and implementation strategy.
